



Freedom Act

- \$25 an hour minimum wage (including gig work)
- \$3500 a month UBI per person under a \$42,000 yearly income
- UBI based on the previous or projected 12 months
- UBI for under age 16 paid to legal guardians
- UBI to be non-refundable and non-taxable
- UBI online registration
- 20% consolidated flat tax over \$12,000 a year (with double taxation)
- 20% corporate tax on profits
- 20% value added tax on each stage of sale (paid quarterly)
- 20% value added tax on imports
- VAT registration over \$12,000 a year
- Sole trader registration over \$12,000 a year
- All other taxes, tax credits, duties, tariffs abolished
- 32-hour and 4-day working week entitlement
- 6 weeks per calendar year paid holiday
- Zero-hour contracts outlawed
- Open border immigration legalized
- Naturalization fees abolished
- President of the US eligibility lowered to age 16
- Member of Congress eligibility lowered to age 16
- Voter eligibility lowered to age 16
- US citizen prisoner voter eligibility
- Automatic voter registration
- Presidential election online voting
- The US senate abolished
- Single house government
- US midterm elections abolished
- Washington DC laws to replace state laws/legislation/government
- Executive and legislative dual roles legalized
- Unpaid/refused transaction fees and unarranged overdraft fees outlawed
- \$5 million per SBA business grant (\$50+ billion yearly funds for World citizens)
- \$5 million per SBA reparation grant (reparations for $\geq 1/8^{\text{th}}$ Black American born before 1/1/2020)
- $\geq 1/8^{\text{th}}$ Black American migrants before 1/1/2020 are eligible for the SBA reparation grant

- Reparations shared with the nearest next of kins for dead relatives after the day the act is enacted
- \$2.5+ trillion yearly funds for reparations with the oldest members paid first
- \$250 million maximum loan for SBA loans
- \$250 million maximum turnover eligibility for SBA loans
- 100% government backed SBA loans
- 0% collateral and 0% security for SBA loans
- 50 years maximum loan term for SBA loans
- Tax free gambling winnings
- Wages for NCAA athletes
- The Mann Act repealed
- Physical punishment of children outlawed
- Jury service to be optional
- Funding for free elementary and high school meals
- General classification for legalized films and games
- The US census abolished
- Payola legalized without declaration of payment
- 20% mechanical royalty rate of gross profit to songwriters for first hand music sales (CRB)
- 10% mechanical royalty rate of net revenue to songwriters for interactive streaming (CRB)
- 10% performance royalty rate of net revenue to songwriters for interactive streaming (CRB)
- Maximum 50% recording/mechanical royalty rate to record labels and music publishers
- Existing recording/publishing contracts renegotiated to at least 50/50 equalling the artists
- Maximum 20% of commission to digital music stores
- Mandatory 80% of net revenue to artists and streaming partners for streaming services
- Mandatory artist/fan centric model for streaming services
- Mandatory creator/artist/label/songwriter 30/30/20/20 split for micro sync royalties
- Gender-affirming surgery lowered to age 16
- Transgender self-identification lowered to age 16 (parental consent under age 16)
- Combustible cladding on buildings outlawed
- Free combustible cladding removal on request
- 100% American produced renewable electricity (equivalent consumption)
- Free domestic solar panel installation on request
- Free domestic solar panel repair/upgrade on request
- Free domestic loft and wall insulation on request
- Free domestic triple glazing on request
- Hydraulic fracturing processes outlawed
- Sale of new petrol and diesel vehicles outlawed (PHEV and EREV exceptions)
- US non-organic farming outlawed
- US farming safe GMO list including golden rice
- US manufactured non-organic cigarettes, vape liquid, rolling papers, filters outlawed
- US manufactured non-faux fabric outlawed
- US manufactured non-natural origin cosmetics outlawed
- Selling asbestos products outlawed
- Unlimited funding for a 100% luxury prison standard
- Dog muzzles for Pit Bull Terriers, Rockweilers, American XL Bullies in public
- Dog muzzles for Dogos Argentinos, Fila Brasileiros, Japanese Tosas in public
- Trophy hunting imports outlawed
- Jump horse racing outlawed
- 2-year-old horse racing outlawed
- Whips for horse racing outlawed
- Organ donations opt out policy legalized
- Euthanasia legalized at age 16 (with repeated consent before the moment of death)
- Euthanasia to be administered by a district judge and 4 doctors
- Capital punishment abolished
- All fireworks to require pyrotechnician licensing
- Pepper spray and tear gas use by police and public outlawed
- Batons, stun batons, stun guns, electroshock guns outlawed

- Police batons, stun batons, guns, stun guns, electroshock guns outlawed
- Automatic guns, burst fire guns, handguns outlawed
- Semi-automatic centerfire rifles outlawed
- Pump action centerfire rifles outlawed
- MARS rifles and lever release rifles outlawed
- 5-round firearm magazine limit
- Self defense using guns outlawed
- Airguns over 1 ft/lb of muzzle energy to require licensing (airgun license)
- Long guns to require licensing (long gun license)
- Prohibited weapons to require licensing (prohibited weapon license)
- Unlimited guns for special police
- Licensing/buying/owning/hiring/supervising of guns/airguns/ammunition legalized at age 18
- Borrowing a rifle or shotgun with supervision legalized at age 16
- Possession of an airgun unsupervised legalized at age 14
- 5-year license renewal for sporting guns
- Semi-automatic rifles maximum caliber 0.22 inches
- Shotgun maximum 3 shells including chamber
- 12 ft/lb air rifle muzzle energy limit
- 6 ft/lb air pistol muzzle energy limit
- 2 ft/lb semi-automatic airsoft gun muzzle energy limit
- 1 ft/lb automatic airsoft gun muzzle energy limit
- Airguns with self-contained gas cartridges outlawed
- Prohibition of female genital mutilation with up to a \$50,000 fine and maximum 6-month jail sentence
- Curb crawling decriminalized
- Public sexual activity decriminalized
- Sex work and open licensed brothels legalized
- STD blood test within the previous two calendar months with negative results for sex workers
- Sex workers are required to record their latest blood test for proof by text or email
- Sex workers and brothels can be fined \$100 for repeated offenses and face closure
- Incestuous sexual activity decriminalized at age 16 (based on Rhode Island, US legislation)
- Polygamy marriage legalized at age 16
- Sex work and pornography lowered to age 16
- Marriage without parental consent lowered to age 16
- Teacher and student sexual activity lowered to age 16
- All gambling legalized at age 16
- Sale of alcohol, tobacco and vapes lowered to age 16
- Sale of recreational drugs legalized at age 16 (with potency regulation and consumption rooms)
- Non-medical use class A drugs are prohibited in the same building unit as children under age 16
- Medical use class A drug list including morphine/MDMA/psilocybin
- Drinking alcohol and recreational drug use in public decriminalized
- Cannabis grower licensing
- Cannabis retail licensing
- Manufacturing and selling synthetic cannabis outlawed
- Recreational drug retail licensing
- Recreational drug pharmacy licensing
- Car and light motorcycle learner/full licenses raised to age 18 (excluding mobility cars)
- Car and light motorcycle teacher/instructor ages adjusted to 20 with 2-year experience
- SAT Subject Tests to replace the high school diploma, SAT test, AP exams
- SAT Subject Tests to match OCR UK subjects
- High school to begin at age 10 and to end at age 16, and university to begin at age 16
- Choice of high school classes
- 8 SAT subject minimum in high schools
- SAT Mathematics to be a compulsory high school subject
- SAT Science, SAT Biology, SAT Chemistry, SAT Physics subject availability (in unison)
- SAT Subject Tests to have 25 multiple choice questions and to last 3 hours long
- SAT Subject Test grading: A* = 90%, A = 80%, B = 70%, C = 60%, D = 50%, E = 40%, F = <40%

- Elementary and high school to become optional
- Foundation of the National University Service (NUS)
- 100% debt forgiveness for university loans
- Free tuition fees for university students
- Foundation of the National Health Service (NHS)
- NHS Commissioning Board for commissioning private contracts
- 100% debt forgiveness for medical bills
- Any free private surgeries on the National Health Service
- Any free private dental surgeries on the National Health Service
- Any free private cosmetic surgeries on the National Health Service
- Any free prescription fees on the National Health Service
- Any free disability equipment and home adaptations on the National Health Service
- Any free private residential and nursing homes on the National Health Service
- 5 free postal blood tests on request on the National Health Service
- Single 2-day weigh ins and no rehydration clauses for professional combat sport events
- 10 round maximum for professional boxing events
- 14 oz gloves for pro boxing and elite amateur boxing, 7 oz gloves for MMA (excluding bareknuckle)
- 20 oz gloves and face saver headgear for unpaid boxing events (excluding bareknuckle)
- US local elections to be held in the midterm every 4 years
- Local election reform with 1 councillor or mayor per county or city or borough or town or village
- Purchasing of all foreign US prisoners for \$1 billion per country
- Federal pardons for Edward Snowden, Julian Assange, Chelsea Manning, Reality Winner
- \$500 billion aid to Ukraine (with unlimited weapon and transport usage)
- \$100 billion aid to the NUG of Myanmar
- \$100 billion aid to the Palestine Liberation Organization
- Arms sales to Israel banned until 1/1/2060
- Presidential and congressional elections to be merged
- Presidential elections to be decided by the popular vote and first-past-the-post voting
- Congressional coalition greater than 50% votes overrides the highest overall party percentage
- The House of Representatives increases its membership to 500 maximum seats
- 50 senior senators given seats in the House of Representatives
- Alaska/Delaware/Hawaii/Idaho/Maine junior senators given seats in the House of Representatives
- Montana/Nebraska/Vermont/Wyoming junior senators given seats in the House of Representatives
- 6 non-voting members of the House of Representatives to be allocated voting membership
- Signature requirements for ballot access abolished
- Unlimited donations to political parties from citizens or foreigners without declaration
- Statehood granted to all US territories
- US territories retain national sport team status
- Creation of the Panamerican Union (PU)
- The US dollar available to Panamerican Union members
- The US to change to the UK date format
- The US to sign the United Nations Arms Trade Treaty
- The US to sign the United Nations Mercenary Convention
- Elected Panamerican Parliament group chairperson is appointed President of the Panamerican Union
- Majority quorum for the Panamerican Parliament
- Panamerican Union member countries to be allocated 1 seat each in the Panamerican Parliament
- Panamerican Union members to issue Panamerican Union passports
- Panamerican Parliament elections to be held every 4 years beginning in 2028
- Panamerican Parliament elections to be decided by the popular vote and first-past-the-post voting
- Panamerican Parliament, Panamerican Council, national triple mandates are permitted
- The Panamerican Union flag to be a red version of the European flag
- The Panamerican Union headquarters to be in Washington DC, US
- The Panamerican Union to establish the Panamerican Union Customs Union
- The Panamerican Union website to be at panamericanunion.gov
- The Panamerican Council to be comprised of the heads of government
- The Panamerican Council to initiate legislation and the Panamerican Parliament to pass legislation

- The President of the Panamerican Union to be appointed the Panamerican Parliament speaker
- The President of the Panamerican Union with veto power requiring 2/3 Panamerican Parliament votes
- The Panamerican Court to be in Washington DC, US
- Organization of American States members invited into the Panamerican Union
- The 22nd Amendment to the US Constitution repealed
- World citizen eligibility for the President and Vice President of the US
- United States of Earth invitation by the year 2060 with \$10 billion annual grants per royal family
- The USE legislation to be called the Global Economic Socialism and Reform Act (GESARA)
- The USE flag to be identical to the World Federation flag
- USE states to be allocated 1 seat each in the House of Representatives under US law
- USE states to at least have US English as their second official language
